

Exploring Childcare Options



H appy children cared for by loving caregivers have settled into the GRACE Little Saints Childcare Program hosted at Holy Family Catholic School. This program opened in August 2021 and now welcomes children of GRACE teachers, staff and our Catholic community from ages six weeks to three years old. The program consists of three classrooms featuring a faith-based early childhood curriculum full of music, books, playtime, snacks, and devoted, attentive teachers.

Developed under GRACE President Kimberly Desotell's vision to recruit and maintain top talent within GRACE by

providing an affordable, loving, and trustworthy childcare option for the families of GRACE staff, the program has grown well into its second year. Currently there are three rooms – an infant room, toddler room, and childcare classroom. The program offers a developmentally-appropriate curriculum that strives to enhance social, emotional, physical, intellectual, and faith growth in young children.

Parents and guardians are welcome to take a tour and meet with the Little Saints Childcare manager, Tami VanGruensven. Ms. VanGruensven shares, "I look forward to getting to know the children and their families at Little Saints. It is so rewarding to watch them learn and grow. Current families will have a future-intent sign up, with some babies already booked into next fall. Children are accepted at any time during the year if there is available room. "We want their experiences at Little Saints to be remembered and cherished," concludes Ms. VanGruensven.

The GRACE Finance Committee and the GRACE Board of Trustees have approved the GRACE 2023-2024 tuition rates. Tuition rates can be found at gracesystem.org/admissions/tuitionsand-fees Next year's tuition includes a few creative incentives aimed to help maintain affordable tuition for all families.

These incentives include:

- Active Parishioner Incentive -\$2000 per student
- Sibling Incentive \$200 per student, Fifth+ Student FREE
- New Family Referral Incentive -\$200 per family

All of our resources are focused on improving our ability to achieve our common mission of "building academic excellence and life skills while growing in our Catholic faith." We continue to be focused on enrollment growth in each of our nine schools. This growth helps to maintain our financial stability and offers additional compensation that can be funneled into increased teacher and staff compensation; a priority from our GRACE Strategic Plan.



Our GRACE community members are our greatest ambassadors. Existing GRACE families are eligible for a \$200 tuition discount for each New Family referred that enrolls in a GRACE school.

Wisconsin Parental Choice Program 2023-2024

A pplication edates for the Wisconsin Parental Choice Program (WPCP) are February 1 through April 20, 2023. All students currently supported by the WPCP (also known as the School Voucher Program or Choice) must reapply to remain eligible. New families also must apply and may do so during the same application period. Late applications will not be accepted.

All families, both current and new, must also enroll in their GRACE school online via the TADS enrollment system.

ELIGIBILITY

- To qualify for the program in the 2023-2024 school year, a student must have a family income equal or less than 220% of the federal poverty level income limits. Additional details are available at gracesystem.org/admissions/wisconsin-parental-choice.
- If a family meets the eligibility requirements including established income qualifications, the following may apply:
 - Any new incoming student entering kindergarten through seventh grade
 - Currently enrolled GRACE students entering kindergarten or first grade
 - New or currently enrolled GRACE students who will be entering into the 4-year old preschool program who meet eligibility requirements may apply.

A student qualifies for the WPCP based on their residency and family income. Schools participating in the WPCP are required to post the State of Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction School Report Cards and the Educational Options for Wisconsin students on their websites. 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News from GRACE Technology Services

O ur GRACE Technology Services team has been busy during the 2022-2023 school year. We have been implementing new teacher equipment to help support learning within the classroom. The new laptops and display boards allow for teacher mobility and student engagement with Wi-Fi connectivity and interactive touchscreen technology. The Integration Team has been involved in several system-wide trainings to ensure our teachers are comfortable with the equipment and software they use on a daily basis to support learning.

In collaboration with the GRACE Curriculum Team, we have begun the process of reviewing our technology standards to help develop a consistent, collaborative and integrative curriculum. As we work through this process over the next two years, we are providing our teachers with lesson ideas to begin building commonality in the areas of Digital Citizenship, Keyboarding and Google Tools. Grant monies have been obtained to help provide the necessary tools for this endeavor.

A technology security audit was conducted in the summer. The Infrastructure Team has been diligently working to make improvements to our network based on the results to ensure we are providing the best security for all our employees and students.

We are also in the process of reviewing our GRACE Digital Learning Plan to create new goals for the next five years. This process helps us to celebrate our success and identify our areas of continued improvement.


2022-2023 Snapshot Report




Eighth Grade Tuition Policy

The efforts of families to stay current with tuition payments as agreed upon via the L TADS tuition payment plan are greatly appreciated. Review of eighth grade tuition, fees and lunch accounts is completed each January of the eighth grade year. In the case of accounts that are not up to date for families with eighth grade students, students will not be eligible to participate in eighth grade trips, parties and graduation events. The only exception is the eighth grade retreat as long as the retreat fee (if required) is paid. Families are encouraged to contact the GRACE Finance office at any time with questions or to address payment plans and arrangements.

Tuition Tax Credit

Tisconsin law established a tax deduction for private school tuition, and again, tuition tax credit information is available for the 2022 calendar year online via TADS. The TADS Household Paid Tuition Tax Report provides a breakdown of payments made for the specified household's tuition account during the tax year. When you are gathering your information for 2022 tax preparation, go online to your TADS account and select Billing. Select the hyperlink titled Household Paid Tuition Tax Report | enter 2022 into the Tax Year field and submit.
