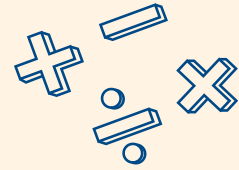

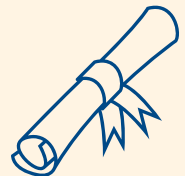

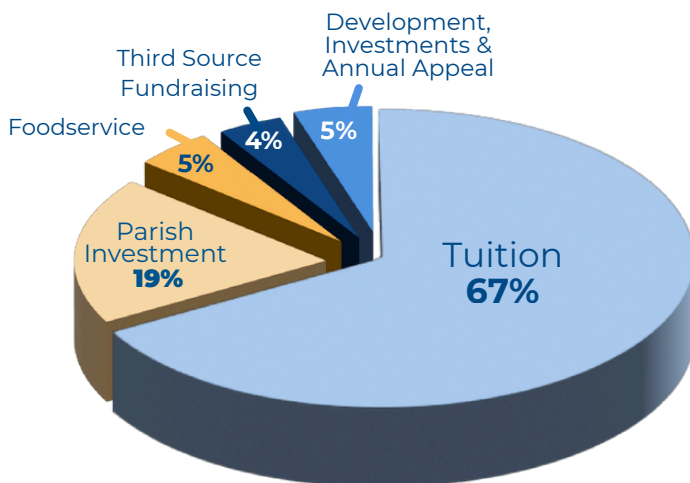

*As a nonprofit organization, GRACE is committed to ensuring that all funds are used to support our educational mission, covering essential expenses such as wages, medical insurance, educational supplies, tuition assistance, and other critical needs. Total revenue grew year-over-year, driven primarily by both private pay and Wisconsin Parental Choice Program tuition as well as increased contributions from our supporting parishes. This increase in revenue enabled us to support essential expenses, including planned wage increases, educational supplies, and higher rent payments to school parishes. Additionally, we were able to make necessary facility improvements and manage unexpected cost hikes, such as rising medical insurance premiums.

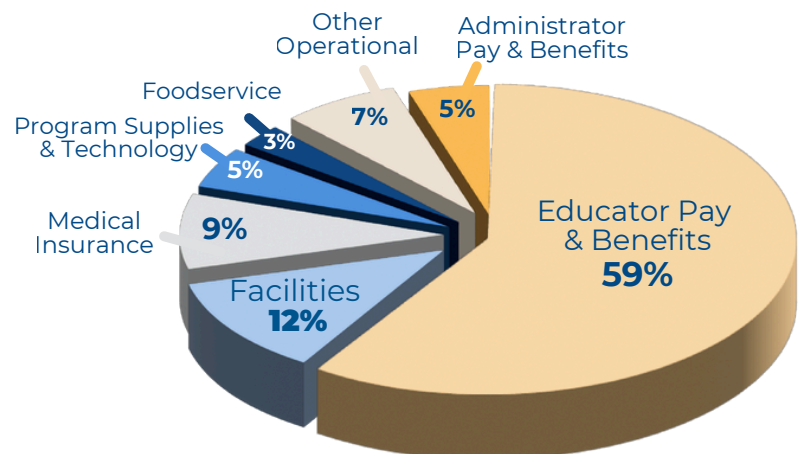

As you can see by the financial information in this report, the past fiscal year concluded with a small deficit, attributable primarily to unexpected increases in medical insurance premiums and to strategic investments in our school facilities that will support long-term growth and sustainability. These investments demonstrate our dedication to providing safe, modern, and welcoming learning environments for our students and staff.



The Finance Committee remains focused on ensuring that our financial decisions align with our mission and values. GRACE is committed to supporting fair and competitive compensation for our dedicated educators while maintaining our commitment to keeping Catholic education accessible and affordable for families across our community.
